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Safety Plans for Returning to School during COVID-19

Macon County High School is committed to ensuring the safety of all students and staff during the re-opening of school. Below you will find the protocols we have implemented to limit and reduce the risk of the spread of COVID-19.

- Temperature checks for all students at the entrances and on the buses
- Temperature checks will be conducted for all faculty and staff
- Wearing masks at all times (required for all students, faculty, staff, and visitors entering the building)
- Transition will be minimized by reducing the number of classes daily
- Modified breakfast & lunch schedules
- One-way traffic in hallways
- Social distancing will be adhered to when possible
- Providing access to individual water bottles/bottled water for student use instead of water fountains
- Hand Sanitizing Stations throughout the facility and hand sanitizer inside all classrooms
- Virtual conferences and meetings with parents
- All classes will have seating charts to assist with contact tracing

Cleaning and Disinfecting

We realize that cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces can help reduce the risk of illness. Classrooms are stocked with cleaning supplies. Classrooms will be cleaned daily. Frequently touched items such as doorknobs, desks, and tables will be cleaned throughout the day.

Stay Home if Sick

You should monitor your child each day for signs of COVID-19. These include:

- Fever
- Nasal congestion or runny nose
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Muscle aches
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Poor appetite
- New loss of taste or smell
- Belly pain
- Pink eye (conjunctivitis)

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
